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「幾年もの間、日本を訪問することが私の夢だった。アニメ映画、マンガに育てられた私はまた、日本のホラー映画の大ファンでもある。目に視える気色の悪いものを見せる西洋のホラー映画とは異なる、恐怖を要素としてうまく利用する日本のホラー映画の仕事は興味深い。これは過去数年間の作品に大きな影響を与えている。巨大な怪獣が東京を襲う。そういう映画・テレビ番組も何作か見た。いつだって東京を救う英雄が現れて、市民は街を復興させる。しばらくの間は平和に暮らすが、新たな巨大な怪物が海岸線に現れる。けれど、彼らは絶対にあきらめない。それは現在に至る日本の歴史、日本人の物語、神話、伝説に関係しているように思う。

遊工房での滞在は本当に創造的で、インスピレーションに満ちていた。短いビデオ・ダイアリーの制作や日本人の即興ミュージシャンとの共演。和紙と墨を用いた作品も試みた。もしかすると、今までこの滞在スペースを使用した様々な作家の創造精神が宿っているのかも知れない。来日する前には私は以前の作品を継続しようと考えていたが、それはすぐに考えが変わった。なぜなら、周りに影響されずに作品をつくるということは不可能だからだ。美しい日光では滝、神社、寺院等、目に映るものは皆心を惹きつけた。伝統的な建築と現代の建築の対照、穏やかな公園と繁華街の対照、ファッション、食物、芸術、それら以外のたくさんのものに対しても。この場は非常に瞑想的で、作品制作だけではなく、私の内なる自己への集中に役立った。ほとんどの時間はひとりで過ごし、それは多くのことを考えるきっかけになった。生活、人々とその営み、芸術、過去と未来といったことを。私はこうしたことを経て、少し成熟してきたように思う。これが私の初めてのアーティスト・イン・レジデンス、そして日本への最初の訪問だった。いま、今回が東京の見納めではないと確信している。ありがとう!また近いうちにお会いしましょう。」

"For many years it was my dream to visit Japan. I grew up on anime movies, manga books, and I'm a big fan of Japanese horror movies. I like the way the creators work with fear, how it isn't as visible and disgusting as it is in the scary moments of their Western counterparts. This has been the main influence on my work for the past few years. I also saw some movies and TV series in which giant monsters were terrorizing Tokyo. But there was always some hero who saves the city, and the community began to repair the ruins. For a while they lived in peace, but then a new giant monster would appear on the shoreline. They absolutely never gave up. It has a lot to do with Japanese history, their stories, myths, and legends up to the present...

My stay at Youkobo Art Space was really creative and full of inspiration. I made short video diaries, performed with different Japanese musicians, and worked with Sumi on Japanese paper. Maybe there is some kind of spirit of creation in this space after so many artists working here. Before I arrived, I had an idea to continue previous works, but after a short time things changed. It's impossible to do something without being influenced by my surroundings. I saw beautiful places in Nikko, waterfalls, shrines, and temples that took my heart away. Also, the traditional architecture in contrast to contemporary urbanism, parks with a peaceful atmosphere in contrast to bustling streets, fashion, food and art, and a whole lot more. I found this place very contemplative, and it helped me to focus not only on my work but also my inner self. I spent my time mostly alone thinking a lot about everything: life, people and their behaviour, art, the past and the future; I feel like I have matured a little in doing so. It was my first residency experience and my first visit to Japan.

For now, I'm sure it wasn't the last time I will see Tokyo. Thank you. See you soon..."
