Preface

Summary of COVID-19's third year

Tatsuhiko and Hiroko Murata

It is still too early to summarize Corona's, pandemic...

COVID-19 began at the beginning of 2020, and the difficult situation continued with the closure of the residency in March, the termination of staff in May, and the suspension of events.

In the fall, in response to the decision to hold the open-air art event, "Trolls in the Park" 2020 in the local area, Youkobo hosted an exhibition by a Tokyo-based artist in November and accepted an residency of three months from December a Japanese artist who had just returned from US on a trial basis to her creative works in residence and studio.

In 2021, studio activities and exhibitions were scaled down to include only Tokyo-based artists.

The seemingly reckless delay of the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games by one year created an unusual situation in Japan, we never forget about such a dangerous crazy, huge and tax waisted events.

In the fall, as in the previous year, we were fortunate to be able to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the "Trolls in the Park" with local art groups.

As an attempt to visualize the "truth of AIR" and the "essence of AIR", we hold an exhibition, "Souvenir from the residency Artists in Youkobo". It was a wonderful opportunity for dialogue with everyone involved through the exhibition.

At the same time, start to compile the picture scroll "Youkobo Mandala", i.e., we began organizing the archives of Youkobo Residence program for more than 30 years, through the works, catalogs, activity records, etc. with the purpose of, "Why did we start AIR?", "What is our AIR?", "What is the artist as an ocupation?", and furthermore, "we have high hopes for the next generation"

The activities to be continued in 2022, the third year of the pandemic, are described in this annual report in detail.

In the third year of the Corona, as well as looking back on the past two years, we have begun to recognize our own age, and have been thinking about the future of the operations based on the residency programs that we have been running so far. Looking back on the Youkobo residency after the pandemic, it is most fortunate that there have been no major accidents in its 35 years of operation in Youkobo.

From now on, we will not overdo it, and regarding the operation of the art space, we will focus on providing the studio as a project space and a place for independent activities of artists living in Tokyo.

We have decided to temporarily suspend the residency programs at the end of March 2023, and to operate the studio as a project space from April onwards. The appearance of a successor will be also a future issue.

In 2023, when the coronavirus will end, I would like to secure new time and space and work on the completion of the long-awaited "Youkobo Mandala" in earnest.

Over the past 35 years, we have been able to leave an unforgettable footprint together with the artists, researchers, and trainees from overseas who have stayed at Youkobo, as well as the domestic artists and staff who have been involved in exchanges such as exhibitions and events. I think

Introduction to Youkobo Art Space

Art is essential to society, providing people with time to reflect on and make new discoveries in their daily lives. Graduated from the University of the Basque Country in 2009, followed by a master's degree in The New School for Design, New York in 2017. He actively presents his works through creative activities, including residencies mainly in Europe and the United States.

He was planning to come to Japan in 2021 as an award-winning artist of "ERTIBIL BIZKAIA 2020". (Note 1, below) Taking advantage of the easing of travel restrictions due to COVID-19, the opportunity to residency in Japan for two months from July to August 2022 has been realized. During his two-month residency at Youkobo Art Space, he developed his first creative activities in Japan, including STOP-MOTION, music, drawing, sculpture, and collage. In particular, the STOP-MOTION shooting was enthusiastically carried out day and night in the vicinity of Youkobo, downtown areas such as Shibuya, and coastal areas such as Koto and Tsukiji. How many frames were recorded? We look forward to the culmination of the work after returning to Japan. In July, he actively participated in student exchanges and workshops at Joshibi together with Natalia Suarez, who was in residency at Joshibi AIR at the same time. In August, we believe that his stay in Japan during the summer was fulfilling, as he spent a week exploring the Kansai art scene, including Setouchi as inland sea area and Kyoto.

At the recommendation of Passa Porta (Note 2, below), she undertakes a one-month research residency at Youkobo in Tokyo. Her original plan was to hold the Tokyo Olympics in August 2020, but three years later, now in September 2022, it finally became a reality. During her residency, she conducted research and exchanges at Youkobo, focusing on writing activities. At the end of the stay, a haikubased workshop "STUDIO HAIKU" was held to commemorate the release of her new haiku book in Belgium, and an event to deepen exchanges was held. Along with the story about the project "STUDIO HAIKU" that produced the haiku medals corresponding to the medals awarded at the Olympics, "Come and write haiku with me. Let's play around with what haiku could be. I'll bring my enthusiasm, all you need to bring is your curiosity!" With this as her motto, playful haiku workshops, discussions,

and enjoyable occasions of encounters have passed with the typhoon.

Note 1: About [ERTIBIL BIZKAIA] and the Program [Young Basque artist's residency in Japan]:

About the Program, Through partnership with the Cultural Department of Bizkaia Regional Government, Spain, Youkobo has initiated activities to host winners of "ERTIBIL BIZKAIA", a funding program that aims to support emerging young artists of the Basque Country, Spain. In 2018, the first year it was accepted at Youkobo, Tokyo and Studio Kura in Kyushu, under collaboration with the Joshibi University as a part of the Y-AIR activity between AIR and art university. In 2019, together with Youkobo, Koganecho AIR, Yokohama and Paradise AIR, Matsudo both in Tokyo area. In the third year, after a two-year hiatus due to the COVID-19, the number of artists scheduled for residency in Japan increased to six, in July and August 2022, a two-month residency programs were held at four locations together with "Joshibi AIR", which was newly started at Joshibi, has also joined as an acceptance program.

Afterwards, we'll write haiku together, we'll create personal haiku medals for ourselves or to reward someone we care about.





Through the practice of the AIR project, we aim to make AIR an element of the artist's activities and at the same time play an important role in society. The Related activities based on AIR activities as an opportunity and place for artists' residency and creative woorks are following four main components: "AIR Exchange Program", "Practice of Y-AIR", "Networking", and "Community Art". And add it's consist following two Components, "Research" and its "archives" across these activities.

2-1. AIR Exchange Program

"Acceptance from international organizations":

Continuous acceptance program based on a memorandum of understanding with an international organization. "Exchange Program with Overseas AIR Organizations" :

The creation of opportunities and space for domestic artists to create work overseas is also an important mission of our AIR program.

After a two-year hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we have finally decided to suspend the continuation of the activities in 2022 with the agreement of the partners and each organization. We sincerely apologize to all the artists who have selected to residency plan in 2020.

2-1-1. Acceptance from International Organizations 2022

① Luxembourg Embassy in Japan and Luxembourg Ministry of Culture:

Started in 2011, accepting one artist/group every year, and accepting eight artists/groups by 2019. The artist has been selected for 2020, but the continuation of activities after that has been put on hold. In 2019, a dispatch program for domestic artist to Luxembourg had just started. one artist dispatched in 2019.

② Asia New Zealand Foundation, (Auckland):

Started in 2015, accepting 5 artists by 2019. The artist has been selected for 2020, but the continuation of activities after that has been put on hold.

③ UFW, The Union of Finnish Writers (Helsinki,):

Starting in 2016, as Tokyo residence of the UFW, 13 writers were accepted. The writers has been selected for 2020, but the continuation of activities after that has been put on hold.

(4)Passa Porta, Belgian Novelist Society (Brussels):

Scheduled to start in 2020, implemented in September 2022. Subsequent continuation plans were put on hold.

2-1-2. "Exchange Program with Overseas AIR Organizations"

2022, both stopped due to corona.
①KAIR, Kosice Artist in Residence (Kosice, Slovakia)
Started in 2013. Until 2016, exchanged one artist each years, 8 artists exchanged in total.
②Finnish Artists' Studio Foundation (FASF) Exchange Program (Helsinki)
Started in 2017. Until 2019, one artist each years, 6 artists exchanged in total.
③ studioName exchange program (Leicester, UK)
In 2019, each one exchanged, 2 artists in total.

2-2 Practice of Y-AIR

"Y-AIR", AIR for Young, are AIR practical activities that started in 2013 through collaborative activities between AIR and art universities. It's practical activities include creating AIR experience opportunities for young artists who have just graduated from art colleges, supporting resident artists through the actual management of AIR, and developing human resources through practical training in AIR management.

2-2-1. Y-AIR Network Forum 2022:

An international forum that aims to build an international exchange program system through the collaboration of AIR and art universities, sharing various practical activities of Y-AIR, and evaluating activities. held for the first time in Tokyo in February 2020 (*Note*)

The 2nd forum was to be held in London in 2021 (London University of the Arts CSM), but was postponed due to the corona pandemic. It was planned to be held in 2022, but was later abandoned. *(Note)*:

Y-AIR Network Forum, an international forum and exchange activities where art universities and AIR collaborate through Y-AIR practical activities, the first was -AIR Network Forum 2020 Tokyo, held in Tokyo in February 2020 (Joshibi University of Art and Design).

2-2-2. Y-AIR Practical Activities 2022:

① LTYE Program (London/Tokyo Y-AIR Exchange Program)

A collaborative program between CSM University of the Arts London and ACME Studio's ASP (Associate Studio Program), Tokyo University of the Arts (TUA) Oil Painting Laboratory and Youkobo Art Space.

An AIR exchange activity program in both cities for new graduate young artists from both schools, and two artists each year will carry out creative activities in both cities for three months.

Started in 2015, by 2019, 20 artists from both countries have been trained.

Due to the impact of the pandemic, it was decided to cancel the exchange program for the time being based on mutual understanding that it would be difficult to continue the exchange program. (January 2022)

② Ai mi Tagai | Ai mi Tagai Project 2022 London:

A group exhibition and activity evaluation project by experienced artists and cooperating art university teachers formed on the occasion of the 5th anniversary of the LTYE program.

The plan to hold the event in London in November 2020, following the one in Tokyo in July 2019, has been cancelled. Apart from the exhibition event, the "Ai mi Tagai Web Project" was implemented (led by the London side) to promote interaction through mutual creative activities online. It continued until September 2021. In 2021, the Tokyo team led studio activities in the Youkobo space that was vacant due to the coronavirus, and held two open studios/exhibitions.

With the active participation of the London side, a unique physical exhibition and interaction under the pandemic were realized.

The feasibility study of holding an exhibition in London in 2022 has begun, and in May 2022, the exhibition was held at the White Conduite Project Gallery, London.

③ Y-AIR Overseas Dispatch Program - University of West Bohemia ArtCamp

At the international art summer school "ArtCamp" held every summer at the University of West Bohemia in Pilsen, Czech Republic, which started in 2013 with the introduction and cooperation of the "EU/Japan Fest Japan Committee (Tokyo)". Since 2013, a program to dispatch art students and artists with the cooperation of domestic art university instructors (laboratories). A short-term stay type (3 weeks) creative exchange opportunity in a different culture is a challenge to international exchange as well as study art. In 2015, the dispatch of the lecturer to the Camp began. Achievements up to 2019: A total of 32 Camp participants (26 students, 4 artists, 2 curators), 5 lecturers dispatched, 3 researchers/interns The event has been canceled due to the pandemic, and the camp will resume in 2022, but the dispatch will be postponed.

4 Y-AIR Artist Exchange Program, Finland and Japan

A Y-AIR exchange program between Finnish microresidence "Art Break" and the University of Lapland, the Japanese side, Youkobo and TUA.Started in 2017 with the "Tenku Art Festival" (Tomi City, Nagano Prefecture) and the base in northern Finland as the base for each activity.Dispatch one young artist to each other. 6 artists exchanged for 3 years.Canceled from 2020 onwards due to the pandemic.

⑤ Young Basque Artists' Residency in Japan:

In response to a request for cooperation from the winners of "ERTIBIL BIZKAIA", young artist support program of the Basque Local Government of Spain for an opportunity to experience AIR in Japan, Youkobo and JOSHIBI activities for young artists started in 2018 in collaboration with art universities. With the cooperation of local AIRs, we continue to work with local art colleges.Starting in 2018, accepted 5 artists in 2 years (Youkobo, Studio Kura, Koganecho AIR). Accepting 6 finalists from 2020 implemented in 2022 as follows, 1 for Youkobo, 1 for Joshibi AIR, 2 for Koganecho AIR and 2 for PARADISE AIR.

6 Tokyo-Melbourne Y-AIR Exchange Program:

Triggered by the exchange in September 2019 of the cultural arts training program "The Japanese Contemporary Art Study Intensive (J-CASI)" at RMIT, a comprehensive university in Melbourne, as a plan to realize the mutual exchange of AIR and art universities between the two cities. We have exchanged a MOU for acceptance to Youkobo from 2020 and mutual exchange from 2021 onwards. Accepted artist for 2020 was decided, but it was canceled due to the pandemic. Subsequent plan had stopped.

2-2-3. Youkobo Internship

GIP, Global Internship Program, an international internship program started in 2006. In addition, in 2013, a student internship as an apprenticeship program, lasting six months to one year, centered on local art universities was launched to develop the next generation of human resources. Youkobo's residency program, exhibition/studio program, as well as related network activities through hands-on experience allow students. GIP had 5 young arts managers from oversea, Student program had 11, 10 from Tokyo based student and 1 overseas til 2020. It remains in a state of suspension due to the pandemic after that.

2-3. "Network activity"

Network activities between domestic and overseas AIR programs and AIR activity support organizations. Aiming to make AIRs a social presence, we actively participate in the international AIR network, domestic AIR network, and other related activity networks. We are also developing our own international activities through the microresidence network established in 2012. Through various network activities, such as connections between AIR programs and AIR activity support organizations, activities opportunities for AIR users such as artists and researchers will be further actualized, activity opportunities will be created, and funds for activity support and operation will be provided. In addition to providing direct support for activities such as raising funds, we are also conducting joint research on various AIR activities. Since 2020, activities due to the corona crisis have been limited to online activities, but we have been considering resuming activities after corona and reviewing all activities.

After a two-year hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we have decided to suspend activities for the time being with the agreement of each partner institution regarding acceptance and exchange of residencies from 2022. With two exceptions in this Annual Report. We would like to express our sincerest apologies to all the artists and researchers who were scheduled to stay in Japan in 2020. • AIR Activity Network 2022 Topics:

①Res Artis World Conference

September 2021 was held in Bangkok (Organizer: Res Artis, Co-sponsored (host): SAC Gallery, Bangkok), and in 2022, it was scheduled to be held in Kiu, Ukraine, but was canceled due to the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

(2) Microresidence network

Implementation of the 2021 "AIR and Pandemic Study Group" and publication of survey activity records. In addition to inquiring about the situation of the COVID-19 pandemic of the microresidence operators, we conducted a questionnaire survey on the activities of the artists, who are residents, under the COVID-19 pandemic. After that, additional interviews were conducted at random, and the results of the investigation were compiled and published as a report.

2-4. "Community Art, Regional Activities"

We believe that it is an important role of Youkobo in the region to make the social presence of artists widely recognized through their art activities. As an opportunity to experience contemporary art close at hand, youkobo not only organizes events itself, but also cosponsors such as the open air art exhibition "Troll in the Park" at the local Zempukuji Park, and the Saturday class "Art Kids" at Momoshi, the local public elementary school. At the same time, we are actively promoting cooperation with various art groups active in the region.

Collaboration with local educational institutions (elementary, junior high, high schools, vocational schools, etc.), art NPOs, creative classrooms, galleries, etc. is also an important aspect of utilizing local resources.

• Topics in 2022

① Troll in the Park 2022

November 3 (Thu) to 23 (Wed), 2022, Zempukuji Park

The open air art exhibition "Troll in the Park" celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2021. It started in 2002 with only three young domestic and foreign artists. The event has taken root in the local community, with outdoor installations and performances, as well as various art events that extend from the park to the nearest JR station. In 2022, the 21st year, it was held under the unified theme of "Signs ~ Kizashi ~" while there were restrictions due to the ongoing corona disaster. Youkobo Art Space also participated as a satellite venue.

"Troll in the Park in Spring 2022
 "

April 28 (Thu) to May 8 (Sun), 2022, Momoshi-no Mori, Zempukuji Park

Held the Troll in the Park Children's Spring Exhibition for the 18th year, an open air exhibition of 98 fourth graders of Momoshi Elementary School. "Troll in the Park" was held for one month from April to May, when the weather was fresh green for the first 3 years from 2002. In the spring of 2005, a contemporary artist from NYC, Ushio Shinohara, and 102 fourth-graders from the Momoshi Elementary School created their own "Spring Birds" using cardboard boxes, coloring the fresh greenery of Zempukuji Park in a powerful and colorful way. Since then, every year during Golden Week in the spring, the Children's

Spring Exhibition has been held at Zempukuji Park's "Momoshi-no-Mori" as "Troll in the Park in Spring", which has become a part of the 4th grade class, and has been held continuously ever since.

Photo exhibition, "Trolls in the Park, Open Air Art Exhibition" was held at the Library.

2-5. "Research"

With the intention of further manifesting AIR, various activities and research conducted through collaboration between AIR and art universities, we are also holding debriefing sessions on the results of these activities and viewing materials, etc. In particular, the existence of "microresidences" and their network activities are emphasized. As research and research activities through the practice of AIR activities, in addition to own research, we actively hold and participate in AIR mutual visits based on face-to-face dialogue, TERAKOYA meetings, open forums, symposiums, etc. are being implemented. These activities are important activities to appeal to society the existence of AIR as a social device. Research and survey activities are summarized as reports and published through the Web for information sharing depending on the budget in a timely manner as well.

①"Souvenir from the residency Artists in Youkobo" and "Youkobo Mandala"

Started in September 2021, the Youkobo AIR (residence) artist/researcher residency project, which started in 1988(*Note*), began full-fledged organization of artworks and materials, including items donated by artists. In conjunction with the open air art exhibition "Troll in the Park 2021", we have begun to display as "Souvenir from the residency Artists in Youkobo" in November to December. At the same time, a dialogue session was held based on the "Youkobo Mandala", an activity overview chart that summarizes the actual situation of activities with each artist, creative activities during the stay, and events that can be read from various exchange activities. This activity continued until March 2022.

Through the comprehensive work of organizing the Youkobo residency activity materials this time, it became clear that the start of the Youkobo residency program was 1988, although it had previously been assumed that it was in 1989.

2-6 Archives

Various activities related to AIR practices, further manifestation of microresidences, and research into infinite possibilities through collaboration between AIRs and art universities will be published as an activity report to be shared.

We are trying to organize it as an archive along with the activity records of Youkobo artists.

Data on domestic and overseas AIR programs, records of activities outside of the artists' residency, and archives of research results are made available for viewing in sequence. Advice on participating in AIR programs, consultation on AIR establishment and networking, etc., are also accepted in a timely manner. Through surveys and research on AIR programs, we are also promoting activities to actualize AIR and "microresidences." Together with artists, we hope that the significance of their activities in society will spread widely. The pandemic caused by the COVID-19 has presented many challenges to people's lives so far. We are required to act with an awareness that is not inertia, such as the contradictions in our immediate society and global issues. We think that it is now more than ever required to deal with matters with the awareness of public assistance. We are organizing what art can do, what we can do with artists, and what we can think about through the management of residencies so far. In the hope that dialogue will progress through the Youkobo Mandala, we would like to set up a public archive center in Youkobo after the pandemic and tell the real story of AIR.

Archival materials were moved to Building-2 for storage. (In April 2022, due to the partial reopening of the Residence Program 2022, the entire Building-1 will be used.)
